

APRIL 11, 2017

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners was called to order by President Rudolph at 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 11, 2017 in the Township Building.

The following Commissioners were present: Messrs. Rudolph, Kelly, Dr. Janiczek, Layden and Lanciano. Mrs. Sage and Mr. Wechsler were absent. Also present were Messrs. Fulton and Byrne, and Mrs. Warner.

The Invocation was given by Reverend Wylie Johnson and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dr. Janiczek read a Proclamation establishing May 1, 2017 as "Loyalty Day" in Springfield Township. The Loyalty Day Program is scheduled to be held at the Township Building on Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

On motion of Mr. Lanciano, the minutes of March 14, 2017 be approved as submitted. Seconded by Mr. Layden and carried.

Mr. Rudolph asked if anyone in the audience wished to comment on any of the agenda items. Seeing none, the meeting continued.

Mr. Rudolph called for Committee Reports.

Mr. Kelly reported the Planning Commission will be meeting on May 4<sup>th</sup> to review a Preliminary Land Development Plan for Springfield Hyundai, 754 Baltimore Pike and the revised Preliminary Land Development Plan for the Springfield School District regarding the construction of a new high school building.

Mr. Kelly reminded residents that the Friends of the Library Spring Book Sale will be held in the Township Building on Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> from 10 am to 4 pm, Sunday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> from Noon to 3 pm and Monday, April 24<sup>th</sup> from 9 am – Noon.

Planning Commission

Library

Mr. Kelly reminded residents that the Library provides a homebound delivery service for those who cannot get to the Library. The Youth Program spring sessions will begin April 24<sup>th</sup> through June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Recycling

Dr. Janiczek reported for the month of March 2017, total trash collected was 723.5 tons, paper recycling was 103.03 tons and commingled/single stream was 80 tons, TV's and monitors, which are collected for a fee, was 1.3 tons and refrigerators & air conditioners was 1.1 tons. Dr. Janiczek announced the Township will be sponsoring a free shredding event on Saturday, June 3 from 10 am – 1 pm.

Health

Dr. Janiczek reported for the month of March, the Health Officer inspected 9 restaurants, 3 retail establishments, and performed 2 reinspections. Two schools were also inspected. Dr. Janiczek announced Earth Day is on April 22 and it will coincide with CRC's 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Stream Clean-up. A Household Hazardous Waste event is scheduled for Saturday, May 6<sup>th</sup> from 9 am – 3 pm at the Marple Transfer Station.

Golf Course

Mr. Layden reported total rounds for the month of March at 685, bringing the year to date total to 2,423. Total revenue for the month was \$25,066, which brings the year to date revenue to \$91,737. The number of rounds was down due to the golf course being open only 18 days because of bad weather. He stated the golf course is in great shape.

Public Works

Mr. Lanciano reported the Highway Department is in the process of inspecting all Township streets for the 2017 overlay season. The upcoming projects include base repair, manhole casting adjustments and handicap ramp inspections. Due to the upcoming Good Friday holiday on Friday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, trash and recycling will not be collected.

Ice Rink

Mr. Lanciano reported the Ice Rink has closed for the season. Over 6,500 skaters enjoyed public skating from October through mid-March. Many of the skaters were new

to the sport as 2,900 skates were rented during the same time period.

Mr. Lanciano reminded residents who are interested in joining the pool this season to submit their applications by April 30<sup>th</sup> to enjoy the discount that is available.

Mr. Rudolph announced Loyalty Day will be held on Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup> at the Township Building at 10 am. The Board of Commissioners will be honoring three emergency first responders. Residents were invited to attend the ceremony.

Mr. Rudolph reported that Fire Chief Bunk Woolson has suffered a medical setback and is getting better. We hopefully expect that he will be back to work within the next month. On behalf of the Board, we wish for him to have a speedy recovery.

Mr. Kelly moved that all bills approved for payment by the appropriate chairperson be paid. Seconded by Dr. Janiczek and carried.

Mr. Kelly moved for the adoption of Resolution #7-17 authorizing the proper officers of the Township to execute a one year Mowing Agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the mowing of State Road, from Rolling to Springfield Road, which encompasses approximately two acres. Seconded by Mr. Lanciano and carried.

Mr. Layden moved that the Board of Commissioners approve the Jamgochian Subdivision/Land Development Application, 500 Saxer Avenue, as per the Township Engineer's report dated March 28, 2017. Seconded by Dr. Janiczek and carried.

Dr. Janiczek moved to authorize the receipt of bids for the 2017 Overlay-Milling Program. He stated the Township will continue to partner with Marple and Swarthmore to
