**Welcome to Springfield Township!** Home to over 24,000 residents, our vibrant community is located in Delaware County, Pennsylvania, only 12 miles Southwest of Philadelphia. We are conveniently located near Philadelphia, Chester, and Montgomery County. Since 1924, the Township of Springfield has been governed under the provisions of the First-Class Township Code. It traces its governmental beginning to June 21, 1686, when the early settlers from Europe secured land grants from William Penn.



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# Trash and Recycling

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Springfield Township is a leader in recycling in Pennsylvania. This can be attributed to the conscientious effort of many of the residents of Springfield.

Every week, mixed papers, and commingled materials (including glass, steel, aluminum, cartons, plastics #1 through #7) are picked up at the curbside. Recyclables will be picked up once per week on your recycling day.

Recyclables should be put out to the curb the evening before your collection day or before 7:00 a.m. The containers that hold the recyclables are available, free of charge, at the Township or Public Works Buildings. Commingled recyclables go to Republic Services and newspapers go to Rock-Tenn.

Garbage and rubbish collection days are split into two different schedules for Areas 1 & 2. [Click here to find your zone.](#)

**Area 1** - Monday & Thursday

**Area 2** - Tuesday & Friday

In the event of a holiday, please hold your trash and paper/commingled recycling until your next scheduled collection day.

To schedule a bulk pickup, you have the option to fill out a [Bulk Pick Up form](#) online or you can come to the Township Building located at 50 Powell Road or the Public Works Department located at 1258 Church Road to prepay and pre-schedule for a pick-up.

- The fees are \$30.00 for a standard pick-up truck, \$40.00 for a dump truck, and an additional \$20.00 for each appliance except TV's which are \$50.00 per TV and \$10.00 for each propane tank.
- Bulk pick-ups are only done on Wednesdays and the cut-off time to prepay and pre-schedule in person is Tuesday the day before by 12:00 pm. or you will have to wait until the following week. Items cannot be put out until after 12:00 pm Tuesday the day before.

The owners and/or occupants of commercial, municipal, and institutional buildings shall be responsible for the separation, storage, and collection of recyclable material.

- At a minimum, the following materials shall be separated and recycled: mixed paper, cardboard, aluminum, glass, cartons, plastics #1 through #7, and leaf waste.
- A recycling report detailing the tonnage of material collected will be required to be submitted annually to Springfield Township.

There are **Several Park Regulations** you should know:

1. No person shall be allowed in a park except between the hours of sunrise to sunset, unless a special permit is granted by the Park and Recreation Board.
2. No person shall stand or lie on a table, bench, or seat.
3. No alcoholic beverages or drugs or persons under the influence of either one shall be allowed in a park.
4. No gambling, or obscene or indecent act or language, or any conduct that may annoy others shall be allowed in a park.
5. No person shall park any vehicle in any portion of a park except in the proper parking areas, and no person shall occupy a parked vehicle after dark except with the interior light on.
6. No person shall injure, damage, or deface any buildings, trees, plants or equipment in any park.
7. No person shall light or permit a fire to burn in a park, except in fireplaces provided for such purposes.
8. The playing of golf is prohibited in any park.
9. The use of javelins, arrows, discus, or similar equipment dangerous in character is prohibited.
10. A permit must be obtained for groups more than 25 persons and for groups interested in playing organized sports activities.
11. Residents walking their dogs in Parks are to have the dog always leashed and must clean up after their pets.

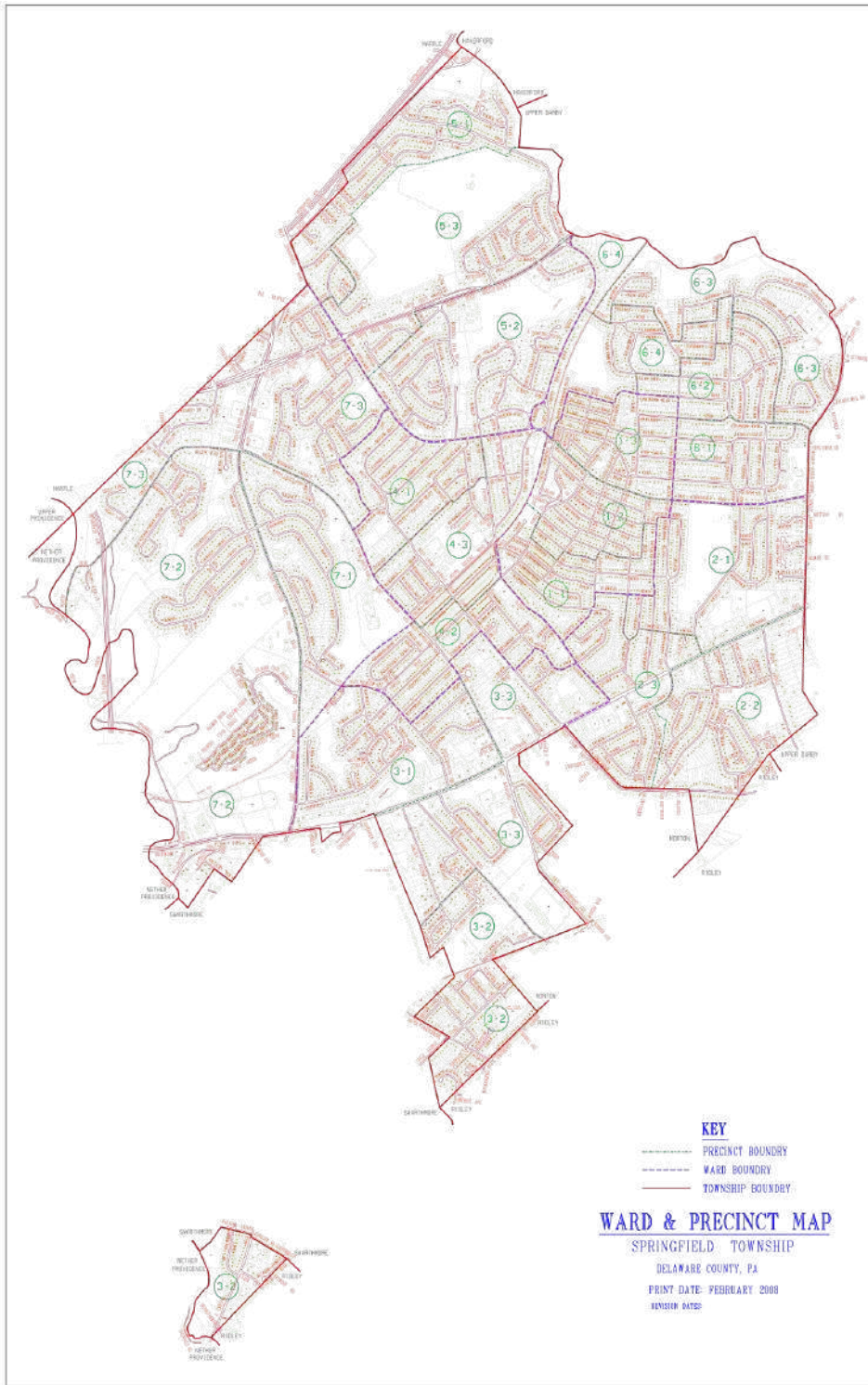

## VOTE BY MAIL

Everyone in Pennsylvania is eligible to vote by mail. Apply for your mail-in or absentee ballot **here**. Make sure you complete the ballot in blue or black pen, fill in the bubbles completely, insert the ballot in the inner secrecy envelope before inserting it in the outer envelope, and sign the voter declaration on the outer envelope. Ballots can be mailed via USPS or placed in any ballot drop box in Delaware County.

Springfield Township has a ballot drop box outside the Library.

## **Curfew Hours for Minors under 18 years of age:**

### **Ordinance #1395**

Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights from 11:00 p.m. until 5:00 am the following morning; and Friday and Saturday and on the eve of any national holiday, from 11:59 p.m. until 5:00 a.m. the following morning.

## **Article 1 Firearms**

### **Ordinance #1466**

48-1 Discharge, carrying, or possession of firearms restricted. No person shall, except in necessary defense of person or property, carry, possess, fire, or discharge any gun, firearm, bow and arrow, BB gun, air gun, spring gun, paintball gun, or any implement which impels with force a metal pellet or projectile of any kind, within the Township of Springfield; provided, however, nothing herein shall be interpreted to prohibit the firing or discharge of said implements at properly constructed and supervised ranges which have been approved by the Chief of Police of the Township of Springfield. Adopted this 11th day of September, 2007 by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Springfield.
